

Callow Hall, the Peak District's newest boutique hideaway is offering an irresistible package in celebration of the Queen's Jubilee next month. Nestled in 35 acres of gardens, wild meadow and woodland, the Victorian country house hotel opened to rave reviews last year, offering 15 individually designed bedrooms. with additional luxury accommodation provided in 11

romantic woodland Hives. And this month, two family-sized Treehouses join the line-up.
